The Lenten season is quickly coming to a close. It has been a blest one for sure. Our worship services each Sunday have been well attended as have the Wednesday Lenten study groups. Holy Week is quickly approaching with Palm Sunday a week away. This week is the most sacred of the Christian year. No matter how many times we have made the journey to Calvary it still is difficult for us to fully grasp the immense love God demonstrated to the world in sacrificing his only Son for the sins of the world. The wondrous love of God for each of us is difficult to comprehend.

The message of Easter is one that the world needs to hear! It is one filled with **HOPE**! The lifeless body of Jesus that had been placed in a borrowed tomb is now alive. That cold, dark tomb could not contain Jesus. The glorious news of Easter is that Christ is alive and moving in the world today. What a hopeful message this is for a world in turmoil.

Despite all the problems this old world provides let us focus our lives on the **hope** the resurrection of our Lord gives us and not allow the distractions of the world to get us off course. As one of the great teachers of the faith once wrote the resurrection of Jesus stands fast as a fact, unaffected by the waves of skepticism that ceaselessly through the ages beat themselves against it. It holds within it the vastest hope for time and eternity that humanity can ever know.

The **hope** of Easter assures us of new life. In the days following Easter the earth will spring forth with all kinds of new life. The trees soon will have leaves again, the orchards will break forth with blossoms, and the grass will spring up a brilliant green. As nature comes alive we who believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ break forth in new life. The tomb is empty - this is our **Hope** by which we stand. Alleluia! Christ is Risen as He said.

I hope all of you will make an earnest effort to attend all the services that are planned for this sacred season of the year. Easter provides us with the hope we need for living today and the days beyond the grave. A blessed Easter to each of you!

#### Maundy Thursday



As of this writing we have received \$830. Let us see if we can receive \$1600 by Easter Sunday. **If we all do a little, it adds up to a lot.** 


#### Fort Steuben Quilt Show

Coffee, Tea, and Us will meet on Thursday, April 20th at 10:30am in the office at Ridgewood. This is just a time of getting to know each other.


The Ridgewood Community Caring Team will meet on May 16th at 10:30am to plan future activities.
