


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK BY REV. DR. BILL N. LAWRENCE

The price for the freedom we celebrate on the Fourth of July has been costly. Create this colorful July 4th craft.

#### What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw

#### What you do:

- Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!

### Independence Day Lessons for Church Life

**Return to the basics** — On July 4th we commemorate the origins of our country. In terms of faith, we also periodically need to hear again the foundational stories of Creation, the Israelites and, of course, Jesus.

Honor the gift of freedom — "For freedom Christ has set us free ... do not submit again to a yoke of slavery" (Galatians 5:1, ESV).
